

# Role description for a ... Scout Active Support Member



**Title:** Scout Active Support Member

**Outline:** The flexible nature of Scout Active Support lends itself to people who want to be involved in Scouting and benefit from opportunities for flexible volunteering. Scout Active Support can take up as much or as little time as the volunteer wishes.

**Responsible for:** As defined by the Group Scout Active Support Manager.

**Responsible to:** Each Scout Active Support member is responsible to the Group Scout Active Support Manager for carrying out the work of the Scout Active Support Unit.

**Main Contacts:** Group Scout Active Support Manager, Group Scout Leader, Parents / carers of the section members, Section Leader, Assistant Section Leaders, Section Assistants.

**Appointment Requirements:** To understand and accept The Scout Association's policies, have a satisfactory CRB clearance, completion of Essential Information (Module 1) as detailed in the Adults Personal File and The Scout Association's Adult Training Scheme.

Those holding roles within a Scout Active Support Unit should also complete those modules relevant to the nature of their Unit's work or focus. This could include Module 3, *Tools for the Job*, Module 12, *Providing a Balanced Programme*, Module 17, *Activities Outdoors*, or any other relevant module(s).
